ABOUT THE WORKSHOP

This workshop will contribute to the continuing development of the architectural professional by exploring how buildings, their approaches and immediate surroundings can be designed, built and managed to achieve an inclusive environment. It is based on NBR legislation, SANS10400-S as well as international standards such as BS8300-1 (2018), BS8300-2 (2018) and ISO21542.

It will go beyond the minimum requirements and the aim is to give built environment professionals the information they need at the outset of a project to achieve an accessible and inclusive environment and to anticipate and overcome any restrictions and barriers that prevent any user making full and independent use of the built environment.

It recognizes that everyone wishes to use the built environment in different ways, for example as residents, visitors, spectators, customers, employees, holders of public office, or participants in sports events, performances and conferences. Everyone, including disabled and older people with particular access requirements, should be able to enter, use and leave a building easily, comfortably and independently, including being able to escape in the event of fire or other emergency.

It is advised that the recommendations that will be provided in this workshop are applied at the earliest possible stage in the design process, that checks are made before handover of a building to ensure that the recommended facilities have been correctly installed, and that arrangements for their continued maintenance are in place.

The workshop will focus largely on new buildings, but assessing the accessibility and usability of existing buildings for their improvement will also be addressed.
